The challenge is knowing when you're truly ready to begin.

This guide will help you assess your readiness, avoid common mistakes and take the first steps towards a successful renovation or extension.



1. Clear and confident

Before considering plans, permits or budgets, take a step back and ask yourself one simple question, what problem are we trying to solve? Many projects begin with a solution before the problem has been properly defined. More space isn't always the answer. Neither is a larger kitchen, additional bedroom or open-plan living area.

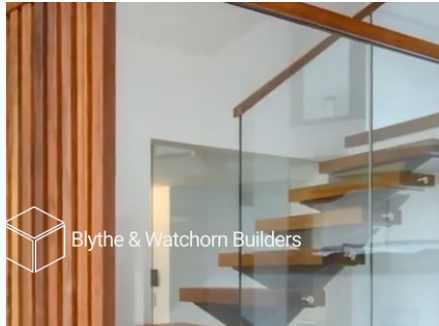
The best projects begin with a clear understanding of how you want to live.

Consider:

- What frustrates you about your home?
- Which spaces work well?
- Which spaces don't?
- How has your lifestyle changed over the past 5 years?
- How do you want your home to feel?
- What activities or experiences could your home better support?



2. Assess your readiness

It's one thing to dream about a renovation or extension. It's another to be genuinely ready to move forward. Many projects stall or become stressful because homeowners start too early, before they've aligned their expectations, timing, finances or decision-making processes.

Taking a moment to assess your readiness now can help you avoid frustration later and ensure the experience is as enjoyable as the outcome.

Being "ready" doesn't mean having every detail figured out. It means having enough clarity and ensuring you feel confident about taking the next step.

Excitement is important. Preparation is essential. A successful project requires alignment across 4 key areas:

1. Vision

You know what you're trying to achieve.

2. Timing

You have considered when the work should begin and how it fits into your life.

3. Decision-Making

Key stakeholders are aligned and able to make decisions throughout the project.

4. Investment

You have realistic expectations around costs and contingencies.



3. Understand your budget

One of the most common causes of project stress is uncertainty around budget.

Many homeowners begin planning without a clear understanding of what their desired outcome may cost.

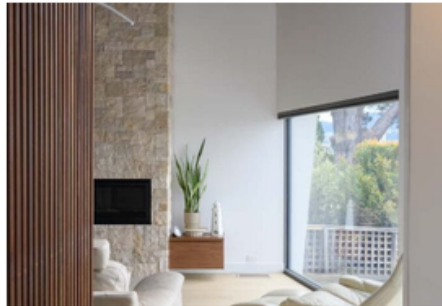
While every project is unique, having an honest conversation about budget early creates better decisions later.

Consider:

- What level of finish are you hoping to achieve?
- Are you planning a cosmetic update or a significant transformation?
- Have you allowed for site-specific challenges?
- Have you considered contingencies?

4. Build your team

Choosing the right people can have a significant impact on your experience and outcome.

Look beyond price. Consider communication, transparency, experience and cultural fit.

Questions to Ask:

- (1) Do they understand the type of home we want to create?
- (2) Do they communicate clearly?
- (3) Can they demonstrate relevant experience?
- (4) Do we trust them?

5. Plan for success

The most successful projects are rarely the fastest. They're the best prepared. Good planning helps minimise delays, budget surprises and decision fatigue. The more clarity you create upfront, the smoother the journey is likely to be.

Consider:

- Your preferred timeframe
- Living arrangements during construction
- Desired level of finish
- Long-term plans for the property
- Key non-negotiables
